Madam Arabella's Column



Fellow Kincaids, Kinsfolk Friends!

The sun is shining and for the first time in recent memory and I am sitting outside to write my column which is a joy! The birds

are singing and bees buzzing.

Exam season is upon us with Angus and Jessie working hard for their AS levels and GCSEs respectively, along-side many of your families no doubt. It can be a stressful time and it is good to have the summer holidays starting in a few weeks time. As a family we have our week in Edinburgh to look forward to at the end of August and then Giles and I are hugely enjoying the thought of our week in Colorado in early September.

In a recent Chiefs meeting we were looking at some of the bigger Scottish anniversaries coming up over the next few years. In 2018 it will be 450 years since Queen Elizabeth 1 of England ordered the arrest of her cousin Mary Queen of Scots, after she escaped from Loch Leven Castle in 1568. In 2019 it will be the 300th anniversary of the Jacobite uprising at Eileen Donan, and in 2020 the 700th anniversary of the signing of the declaration of Arbroath; this is the one that caught my eye (especially since it is all about the desire for Scottish independence and with the recent memories of the 2014 Scottish independence vote so fresh in all our minds it shows that although the circumstances are not quite the same, to say the least, there really is nothing new under the sun!) and led me to a little more reading around what is probably the most famous document in Scottish history...

"The Declaration of Arbroath was and has been unequalled in its eloquent plea for the liberty of man. From the darkness of medieval minds it shone a torch upon future struggles which its signatories could not have foreseen or understood." John Prebble.

There is only one surviving copy of the document remaining, as the original copy sent to the Pope was lost. It has become a National Treasure and is housed in the National Archives in Edinburgh. I confess I have not yet seen this piece of history but it is on my planned list of summer holiday activities. I understand that this document is highly likely to have had an influence on the founding fathers writing of the American Declaration of Independence. It truly is a most beautiful and stirring piece of writing.

The author is not documented although it is thought most likely written by Bernard of Kilwinning, Abbot of Arbroath and Chancellor of Scotland. It is a moving plea written to the Pope in the midst of the wars of independence going on between Scotland and England. It is signed by 8 earls including Malcolm, 5th Earl of Lennox (my 24 X Great Grandfather) and about 40 other Barons

asking him to recognise- amongst other things- Scotland's Independence, Robert the Bruce as King and the right for Scotland to defend itself if unjustly attacked. Once it was signed it was taken by Bishop Kinimund to the Papal Court at Avignon in France.

Sir James Fergusson, formerly the keeper of the records in Scotland translated the most widely known text into English in 1970. Below is the most well known extract from the letter, you probably know it well already but it is surely worth reading again:

"For as long as but a hundred of us remain alive, never will we on any conditions be brought under English rule. It is in truth not for glory, nor riches, nor honours, that we are fighting, but for freedom - for that alone, which no honest man gives up but with life itself".

On matters closer to home, Angus will be in his final year at school next year and he has just been nominated as President of the Schools Reeling Society. They have just held a white tie dinner and dance. It looked such fun! He is also fully immersed in all aspects of school life and has become known as 'the singing rugby player'! He was interviewed after a singing a solo at a choral evensong in the Queens College Chapel, Oxford. A short extract follows:

"Angus Kincaid, one of the soloists, told me that he felt he had sung his part right for the first time ever. Angus is a Scottish Laird and future Chief; he is also a keen rugby player. I asked him if it was scarier singing in front of a packed chapel congregation or playing rugby. He replied that you have to be a real man to sing in a choir."

Next week Giles and I will be attending The Garden Party at Buckingham Palace which is always a spectacular affair. The military bands playing under the trees and the long white marquees filled with tables piled high with the most British of afternoon tea delights; a day to look forward to.

I hope that in the second half of 2016 every challenge will bring with it an opportunity for something good and this comes with my warmest wishes for a restorative summer break.



Kincaid Surname DNA Project Update 5/10/16

We are happy to report that the Kincaid Surname DNA Project continues to grow. We now have 257 participants involving the various DNA tests currently available. The largest increase over last year has come in the Family Finder DNA test which tests autosomal dna for both maternal and paternal kin. The Y dna tests remain the main focus in determining Kincaid family lines and we have 231 who have done one of the 12, 25, 37, 67 or 111 dna marker tests. All 231 show on our Y dna chart on our website www.kincaiddna.org along with other information about dna testing. The newest and by far the largest dna test is the Big Y dna test which is for males and tests around 26,000 SNP dna markers. It costs between \$475 and \$575 depending if on sale or not. We have 9 participants who have done the Big Y test with most in Group A which comprises over half the total participants. If anyone wants to confirm that their line is an unbroken male Kincaid (of any spelling) line, please contact one of the Kincaid Surname DNA Project administrators and we will tell you how you can do this for around \$25 because if you show the last SNP mutation then you will definitely share all the SNP's above the last known SNP. The Big Y results indicate most of our Kincaid lines were in England prior to Scotland and Northern Ireland. We have 7 participants who show to have Viking dna and we hope to discover how this came about in time.

We look forward to visiting with Kincaids of all spellings at the Long's Peak Scots/Irish Festival in September. We will be at the Kincaid Tent at various times to answer questions on dna testing and will have dna test kits and applications available for new participants. We look forward to meeting many Kincaid's we have exchanged info with over the years at the Festival.

We asked our fellow administrator Sue Liedtke who traces back to Andrew Kincaid in Colonial Virginia to write about the autosomal dna tests results and how she is using the results to determine kinship and her article is below.

Autosomal DNA testing has a fascinating potential. With a wide data base of testers, luck and careful paper work it may be possible to sequence much of the chromosomes carried by Kincaids living hundreds of

years ago. An example of how this is possible comes from my own FTDNA Family Finder results. A large chunk of one of my chromosome 7s has been passed down 7 generations from Andrew Kincaid d 1810 VA or his wife Mary Ramsay. How do I know this? FTDNA sequenced large sections of my chromosomes and compared the results with others who have tested. Of my 7 matches on this section, a 6th cousin once removed shares the longest portion with me. Our 1st common ancestors are Andrew & Mary. Because of ancestral locations & origins, it is unlikely we have a common ancestor in any other line. As FTDNA's data base grows and matches respond to queries, it may be possible to determine if this and other smaller sections shared with my cousin were inherited from Andrew or his wife.

To find parts of Andrew's DNA that I didn't inherit and explain why a large data base and luck play a role, a bit of background is needed. Other than the X and Y chromosomes in a male, each of your 23 chromosomes are paired with another controlling the same functions. One of the pair comes to you from your father and one from your mother. Other than the Y, it would be extraordinary if any of your chromosomes are exactly like the ones your parents have because when eggs and sperms are formed, all but the y strand tend to break and recombine haphazardly with their paired mates. Each of the strands you receive will have DNA sequences from two of your grandparents. The more times this breakage and recombination occurs, the less chance you and an umpteenth degree cousin have of both carrying a significant section inherited from a particular 18th century grandparent. Yet with luck it does happen as shown above.

Recently a 4th cousin in my line down from Andrew joined the Kincaid DNA project. She doesn't have even a tiny bit of the section on chromosome 7 I share with our 6th cousin. In fact the 3 of us have only one small section in another part of 7 in common. She does, however, share a reasonably large section of chromosome 5 plus bits and pieces from 5 and other chromosomes with him. Though a lot of detective work needs done, we now potentially have 2 significant sections as well as 22 small snippets of Andrew's DNA. As straight line Kincaid males and descendants from daughter lines, join the project the picture will become clearer and more of Andrew's DNA may show up. Who knows, we may even find a Kincaid who doesn't descend from Andrew with one of those sections. That would sure help in the search for his parents.

TELL THOMAS KINCAID AND 'THE ONLY WAY OF PLAYING AT GOLVE'

It is generally agreed that the modern game of golf originated in Scotland, where the first written record of golf is James II's banning of the game in 1457, as an unwelcome distraction to learning archery. James IV lifted the ban in 1502 when he became a golfer himself.

In an article for the Lutine Golf Society Christopher Cox states that in 1588 the Earl of Cassilis played a match against The Abbot of Crossraguel on the Ayr links - the stake being the Abbot's nose! He goes on to say that from 1502 to the Revolution in 1688, every reigning monarch of the Stuart line (two kings and one queen of Scotland and four kings of the United Kingdom) was a golfer. The first international match is said to have taken place in about 1688 when the Duke of York (afterwards James II) and a shoemaker named John Patersone defeated two English noblemen at Leith.

Around this time, Thomas Kincaid, son of Thomas Kincaid the great Edinburgh surgeon, set down his views on playing golf in An Edinburgh Diary 1687 – 1688. The entry for 20th January 1687 starts: 'After dinner I went out to the glove with Henry Legatt. I found the only way of playing at glove is ...' He goes on to record his views on how to stand, how to hit the ball, and the part played by various muscles, the body, the legs, the arms and even the fingers. He also gives his views on the design of the club and the ball. These are the first known instructions on how to play the game.

Many of you will have a copy of *This I'll Defend – The Story of the Kincaids* which includes his extensive thoughts on how to play golf at pages 75 to 77. It is too extensive to reproduce here, but on 9th February 1687 he 'digested the rules of playing at the glove' into verse thus:

"Gripe fast, stand with your left leg

first not farr;

Incline your back and shoulders, but beware

You raise them not when back the club you bring;

Make all the motion with your bodies swinge

And shoulders, holding still the muscles bent:

Play slowly first till you the way have learnt.

At such lenth hold the club as fitts your strength,

The lighter head requires the longer lenth.

That circle wherein moves your club and hands

At forty five degrees from the horizon stands.

What at on stroak to effectuat you dispaire

Seek only 'gainst the nixt it to prepare."

But are his instructions still valid? At this point I must declare my ignorance about how to play golf, my main sports having been hockey, squash and above all cricket. So I showed Thomas Kincaid's instructions to a few fanatic golfing friends of mine who had this to say.

"What your relative wrote about some of the swing essentials still applies today. Posture, keeping you left arm straight and keeping your head still are all important to achieve a decent swing and good contact with the ball. That said I rather suspect that modern day tuition will be somewhat at variance with what has been written and would be adapted to the size, shape and general physicality of the individual golfer being taught. At top level, there is a major emphasis on power hitting these days with many of the Championship quality courses much longer than they used to be."

"As for the body mechanics, this appears to be it, more or less. I seem to remember from lessons in days gone by that balance, body turn, head still etc are essential. One thing that I do recall, although I struggle with, is that at impact, one should turn, or rotate, the hands through the striking zone, whilst maintaining the natural arc of the swing. Complicated! One point in your relative's instruction suggests that when performing the swing, one should take it slowly, implying that, I think,

the body 'memorises' the action so that it becomes repetitive without having to think about what you are trying to do, except keeping one's eye on the ball."

But all of them said that what had really changed is the design and manufacture of golf clubs and balls:

"On the subject of the ball, the manufacture has changed immensely since the 17th century with the core and cover made from hi-tech materials these days and balls made to have different compressions, which affects the hitting distance achievable. Size of ball used will certainly be different between then and now. Balls used for play in England were smaller than those used in the USA when I first started to play, and were standardised to the American size [slightly bigger] fairly soon afterwards. Clubs are also vastly different from years ago - hazel shafts are long gone. These days shafts come in enormous varieties, are very high tech, made from steel or graphite, and designed to suit golfer's swing speeds.'

"I agree with these comments on the quality of the equipment, including balls, that we use today. Again, this is emphasised by the fact that all the major suppliers seem to 'improve' their equipment, in some cases annually, but generally every 2 years."

Other comments I received generally chimed with the above.

James II banned golf in 1457 as an unwelcome distraction to learning archery. Of course, the ban had long since gone when Thomas Kincaid was playing, but golf increasingly became a lesser priority as archery took over as his main interest: he won the Edinburgh Silver Arrow in 1711 and the Goose Prize in 1713. However, he did retain his interest in golf.

It is fascinating to think that, more than 300 years after his words were penned, much, if not most, of what he set down seems to be generally applicable to today's golfers. I wonder what golfing readers of the *Defender* think of Thomas Kincaid's instructions. Are they applicable to how you 'play at the golve'?
