The Chief's Column

We have had the 2014 Gathering in Scotland organised by James Brisbin, which was a joy for both Angus and I to be a part of. Then another gathering in 2016 in Estes Park, Colorado, again organised by James Brisbin and this time assisted by Patrick Kincaid and Eva Knight. This was my first Scottish Games in the United States and what an unforgettable experience that was! 


